The Passport Challenge will run from


April 5th - August 31st

Yarducopia is a program of the Alaska Community Action on Toxics (ACAT) that promotes safe gardening practices through a model system for organic, regenerative, and community based gardening. Yarducopia works directly with members of the Anchorage community support organic gardening to reconnect people with their food. We coordinate the Midtown Garden Depot, Midtown and Spenard Community Gardens, and a variety of community-scale composting projects around Anchorage.






